ANNA NSW - Report May 2007

Hi to all! I can't believe that it is May already and so much has already been achieved. New to the role of NSW ANNA President in January I was extremely overwhelmed and wondering what on earth made me take this on?? I am discovering why!

With my executive we have looked at many aspects of ANNA NSW and what was already well in place. The first priority was to review the **John Sheard Travel Award** and bring it's monetary value up to a level that would enable the recipient/s to be able to really feel that they were getting value for money. We have increased the amount to a total of **\$1000 or two \$500 awards** to assist in travel/ registration to an upcoming conference/event. There is now a **closing date, the last working day in August 2007, Friday 31st**. We hope to hear from any interested NSW members who feel they may be able to fill the criteria. Our second priority was to review the ANNA Education evenings that had been held and attended with varying success. We circulated an expression of interest and a brief questionnaire to the majority of hospitals who had held education evenings in the past. RNSH Stroke and The Cancer Institute, NSW Collaboration.

The RNSH Stroke Team recently collaborated with the Cancer Institute, NSW in the development of a new anti-smoking advertisement focussing on the link between smoking & stroke.

The advertisement was both graphic & moving showing a middle aged man paralysed and unable to speak being cared for by his wife. The take home messages were "*smoking doubles your chance of a stroke*" and that "*it causes long term disability that not only affects the individual but also their partner and children*". The advert was launched at RNSH by the Deputy Minister of Health on Sun 20th May and runs until the end of June.
